Public and foundations fundings are not a substitute for private donations

Public funding and foundations allow the realisation of large-scale projects such as the rehabilitation of reservoirs, the construction of school buildings, the training or supervision of women's groups, and the running of certain institutions and schools for the most disadvantaged children. But these projects are not enough on their own. Smaller projects, supported by private donations, are essential to the successful running of the larger ones.

In this sense, they meet different but no less essential needs. If the conception of some projects is made possible by donations from public funding, their sustainability is ensured by private donations: the latter meet other needs such as the payment of teachers' salaries, or the development of activities such as the multiplication of beehives which guarantee salaries and hence the independence of several groups of women.

This year again, numerous projects were successfully completed

In 2022, thanks to donations from individuals, OFI was able to fund :

- An English teacher and a kindergarten teacher as part of the "Adopt a Teacher" project at the Sevai Bichendarkoil School, for 200 children from migrant families. The teaching is in Tamil.
- Ten scholarships for children living with AIDS at HUT.
- The distribution of reusable pads to 100 students of the Sevai Shanti School, as well as to 20 girls with disabilities from the ABC association within the framework of the "Pads for Sisters" project.
- The creation of 5 homes for 40 street children in Bangalore in partnership with DIN.
- The addition of 100 more beehives for tribal families as part of the "Busy bees" project with the ISSAI organisation.
- The regular distribution of food supplements to 200 children living with AIDS in partnership with the association Gramium.
